I am proud to report that additional funding and removal of the scholarship cap was accomplished. I was also able to secure funding for the YWCA for construction of early childhood facilities serving our metro region.

Senator Melisa Franzen Education Bills Become Law

- **Early learning scholarships.** This funding will help increase access to high quality early care and education opportunities to ensure all children are prepared to succeed in school and in life. (S.F. 1966)
- **YWCA early childhood.** The funding will be used to design, renovate, furnish, and equip the early childhood center at the YWCA of Minneapolis. The YWCA preschoolers are proficient in 90% of school readiness indicators compared with 53% for their peers across Minnesota. (S.F. 2141)
- **English language learners and Safe School levy.** Additional funding will be used to reform English language learner programs to achieve academic success and schools will be able to acquire more funding to ensure safer learning environments. (S.F. 2328)
- **Safe Routes to Schools bonding and appropriation.** The funding will be used to provide students with improved transit safety to walk or bike to school. (S.F. 687)
